Salt and Light

You are the salt of the earth. But if the salt loses its saltiness, how can it be made salty again? It is no longer good for anything, except to be thrown out and trampled underfoot.

You are the light of the world. A town built on a hill cannot be hidden. Neither do people light a lamp and put it under a bowl. Instead they put it on its stand, and it gives light to everyone in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven.

Our Old Testament reading this morning speaks of the coming of the Messiah, a light to the Gentiles who were in the dark as to the true knowledge of God and by Jesus ministry he was a light to them in their understanding and in their lives.

In our Gospel reading we hear Jesus declare "you are the salt of the earth needed for good health but useless if it loses its flavour". Then Jesus says that we are the light of the world. As Christians our job description is more than personal holiness but to touch the lives of everyone around us. Our light is not just by our words but by our actions in humility and for peace,

When we live as people of blessing, we are salt and light in our work place, our homes and in our nation.

This last year has been a difficult time for everyone of all ages from preparing last March for our first lockdown; at that time we really knew nothing about the pandemic but had no real idea of the all the implications that this would bring to us.

Since then we have been in tiers and lockdowns, churches schools and businesses have been open then closed and we are urged to stay at home.

Easter came and went and all faiths had their celebrations cancelled. Folk had their shopping slots and shopped on line.

Strange times but amidst the chaos light shone out in other ways.

Our Church buildings were closed but we the church were still active in different ways we worshipped and met on Zoom. We kept in touch with each other, the volunteers continued the Food Bank, we sent messages to each other and there was always that friends who searched daily to send us jokes to keep us smiling. We got in touch with friends we hadn't seen for years.

And then the late Captain Tom raised money for the NHS, and Footballer Marcus Rashford, having lived through hunger himself, raised awareness of the shortage of food for children.

This year we learned of the vaccine being produced and the talk in Government was there was light at the end of the tunnel.

As people waited for the vaccine they chatted and supported total strangers.

These last few weeks have also seen Holocaust Memorial Day, remembering the dreadful loss of so many and remembering all the rest of the tragic times and dark times that we've had over the years.

Just as Moses and the light of the burning bush lead his people from darkness of slavery to the light of a new life in a new country, not without its struggles, so the survivors never gave up hope that God was with them and they could see

God's light through all their suffering. Some years ago, I was quite privileged to be able to sit with a lady and hear her testimony

She was a lovely lady, a very cheerful lady and a very grateful lady for anything anyone did for her. She was very young when she survived the Holocaust and she told me that she thanks God every day of her life for her life and her family. Her faith is strong as ever and it shines out.

We also mourned the huge and sad loss of so many people in the Pandemic. This pandemic affects the whole world; but we know now that there is the light at the end of the long tunnel thanks to the brilliant work of our scientists and the vaccine coming. God has led the people once again to a new life, a different kind of living just like he led Moses.

The darkness of winter is fading now, and the light of spring is coming into our lives again, showing that there are new shoots appearing bringing new beginnings, new life, new hope.

And this last week we celebrated Candlemas, remembering the joy of Anna and Simeon recognising the baby Jesus when he was presented in the Temple. They had dedicated their lives to God and were rewarded in seeing the light of the World.

For each of these occasions we lit candles the light shining out in the darkness in remembrance and in hope, although we had to do it remotely. But we knew that collectively our light was shining out in love and hope for our world.

As followers of the Light of the World we too must shine into the lives of others lifting them up supporting them and walking along side of them in their dark times. We are here to hold the Christ light for them in the night-time of their fear. Amen.
