Once upon a time, we were led to believe that the popular thought in society is that men cannot multi-task, that doing two and three things at a time just wasn't, supposedly, in their genes. And I have always begged to differ from this thought and idea having lived in a house full of men for a good number of years, and they can do so many tasks at a time, as many of you will as well.

And here in David, we see David the multi- tasker. David was a shepherd, a poet, a giant killer, a king and, of course, an ancestor of Jesus. David proved that he could multi- task.

But of course, there was another side to the nature of David amongst all of these good roles he had, he was also a betrayer, a liar, an adulterer and a murderer, which reminds us only too well that we too have our failures in our lives, perhaps not to the extreme that David went wrong, but we have gone wrong in our lives none the less.

But one thing about David is he never stopped having faith in God and knew that the nature of God was to forgive. Give David his dues, he was able to summon up the strength enough to confess. I think that this is most definitely something that we do not do enough of – confessing. How difficult is it to come before God with our heads bowed down and to tell God that we have done something wrong? It's not easy is it? Just think about that for a moment

But how awful the story we read today in 2 Samuel. What David did was absolutely dreadful. We know only too well throughout history what horridness comes from soldiers entering into areas of conflict – and if this story was happening today it would be like one of our army leaders sending one of his troops out there to the front line knowing that he or she would be almost up amongst a firing squad, there would be no hope. What an awful thing David to do. When it had been felt that there has been a need for troops to go out to war from out country, we want them to keep them as safe as they possibly can.

David's anger at Nathan is a human reaction – normally if the person we are portraying isn't a true likeness to ourselves, and if it's not displaying the loving character that people know you by then it is embarrassing, you are covering up who you really are. You have been found out and the world around you know the real you! Friends may stand by you, but it is bound to change some of even the closest relationships. David was confronted with the bad side of his nature and he didn't like it. What was seen on the outside wasn't real and genuine on the inside.

But our God is a loving God and even the worst person in the world can ask for forgiveness.

David had obviously been nurturing his soul with the wrong nutrients, the world was feeding him at this time in his life and what he had done certainly wasn't from what God had been feeding him.

When we look to Jesus, we can see only good, because he was doing what God wanted him to do, not what the world wanted him to do, and he had seen just as much as anyone else had and still remained pure.

Bread is of course the focal point in our Gospel reading of John. Oh, my goodness, I just love bread – even the making of it does something to you. You get all of your ingredients together and your away, I love the kneading part of the process – it's all squelchy and messy and then somehow it just all comes together. Or at least it's supposed to!

Jesus appeared on the outside like us and on the inside, he showed all of the qualities that God wants us to have. If we are prepared to come to Jesus and take the simple step of truly believing in Him then we will be in no danger of malnutrition; we will feed be fed His very word.

We cannot live our lives to the full without us seeing that it is Jesus who gives his life for you and for me – for the whole of the world.

The people of Jesus' time were and we today need to be encouraged to see Jesus as the bread of life. If Aleck and I are going to have some homemade soup for our evening meal, I always get some, well what I say is, 'nice bread, special bread' in but if I didn't break open the bread from the crust, then what use is it to us. It would just sit there and look nice and smell nice, but to get the fullness from it I need to break it, break into it beyond the crust to get the full benefit from it. And I think that the same can be said for Jesus, we can sit and look at images of Jesus and even have our own image of Jesus in our mind but until we can experience Jesus and place him straight into our hearts and our bellies, then we are not reaping what he has freely given to us – eternal life. We get the strength that we need for life, we get shown our flawed parts but when we can see even these we are shown the way to change.

When we look to Jesus we can see the good qualities through and through and I would challenge you to find fault or a flaw within Jesus' nature.

Jesus IS the bread of life. He IS where we get our nourishment from. He IS our saviour – he IS our God – Praise be to God and we need to at least try to be like him. In everything that you do this week, I ask that you think to yourself 'What would Jesus do?' and if you do see some of the goodness of Jesus in what you are doing then say 'Alleluiah Praise our Lord' Amen.
